CEEMAN International Management Teachers Academy (IMTA) 2020

In line with the internationalisation of Hanken, faculty members are offered the opportunity to participate in the International Management Teachers Academy 14-25 June 2020 in Bled, Slovenia.

Programme

IMTA provides an intensive two-week programme in pedagogical development providing an opportunity to improve your teaching skills, methods, course design, curricula, and teaching materials. The programme draws on teaching with cases, case writing, performance evaluation and feedback to students. It also provides input in other areas of faculty members' professional life, such as consulting, institution development and administration, and social responsibility.

Week one focuses on common issues related to general aspects of management education, with special emphasis on the case method and project work. The programme also deals with the skills required in the multiple roles of faculty. Week two is structured into disciplinary tracks, when participants focus on requirements and opportunities that are more specific to their particular disciplines.

Who can apply?

This call is for Hanken's faculty members in business and economics who are involved or will be involved in degree education and/or executive education given in English. Applicants should have at least two years of teaching experience as a faculty member at Hanken or at another university. Applicants should have continuous employment, a tenure track position, or be in their first year of a minimum 2-year fixed-term employment contract at Hanken. Experience of or interest in utilising case study learning is also required.

Funding?

Hanken supports candidates to the IMTA programme 2020 including participation fee, economy class return flight ticket, accommodation, and other costs that are within the scope of work related traveling.

If you are interested in participating in IMTA 2020, please submit a freely formulated letter of motivation and an up-to-date CV including specification of your teaching experience and possible previous pedagogical training to the Scholarship Liaison Officer, stipendieombud@hanken.fi by **19 January 2020.**

The IMTA admission team makes the final decision on admission.
