

13. Rights of the data subject

Data are used for statistical purposes. Under the EU's General Data Protection regulation (EU 2016/679), the data subject has the right to inspection, rectification, restriction of processing and prohibiting of processing of their personal data as well as the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority.

- Right to inspection of data (right of access to the personal data
