Virtual Internships Program for Hanken Students

Hanken is for the first time collaborating with Virtual Internships. Virtual Internships will provide you a unique remote internship opportunity with full wrap-around support, guidance, and interventions to enhance your outcomes and experience.

In applying to this internship, you will be guaranteed a 30 hour, 8 week internship in a host company located either locally in Finland, or internationally across the globe. Regardless of where your host company is located, your internship will take place fully online and from behind your laptop. This flexibility allows you to gain career experience and management understanding from the comfort of your own home, and on your own schedule.

Alongside your guaranteed remote internship you will be invited to global webinars on best practices in professional development, have an opportunity to join our online self-paced curriculum, and be invited to two individualized coaching sessions to unpack your skills toolkit and next steps to in your career journey.

Beyond the wrap-around support all participants will be fully guided through their internship by their Intern Experience Manager, who is there to offer feedback, guidance and support regardless of the issue.

The following pages unpack all program inclusions and we look forward to seeing your application to this great professional opportunity.

THE INTERNSHIP PLACEMENT GUARANTEE

VI guarantees an internship placement in the career field of a student's choice, allowing a selection from **over 18 different identified Career Fields**.

In guaranteeing the career field of choice, interns will also be given the chance to rank their three preferred regions or countries amongst the locations offered by VI countries between 1 and 3. VI will endeavour to place interns in one of their chosen countries (in order of preference), but if this is not possible the intern will be placed in another country.

Every other Wednesday all participants are invited to join a 30 minutes Global Experts Employability Series. The topics and speakers range from building soft skills to exploring new industries or career paths. After the webinar is delivered live, you can also view any past webinars on our Youtube channel. Below are the last three sessions as an example of the content type and variety.

Jan 12, 2022

Unexplored work superpowers: learn how empathy, compassion and resilience can be great allies in the workplace

Life is full of ups and downs. Change is the only constant. During this presentation, our speaker will discuss the increasing importance of resilience and wellbeing in the workplace (exacerbated by the COVID-19 Pandemic); how a positive and mindful approach to work and life can help you endure, recover, and thrive from life's challenges; and why empathy and compassion are the new career super strengths.

How to boost your confidence for a work presentation

For many years, Vanessa Cuddeford worked as a news anchor and she was very successful. However, she struggled with public speaking nerves - which she learnt to overcome! In this webinar, she will tell us why speaking nerves are natural (it's written into our genes!) and how we can tackle them. She will also share some tips for presenting clearly and persuasively focusing on how to put content together.

Feb 9, 2022

What are employers looking for in the new (Post) Covid time?

In this webinar Jonathan Brill will discuss what employers really want from recruits at the early stage of the talent pipeline. From his extensive experience as the CEO of Eduvate's online careers fairs, employers value and rank highly resilience and flexibility. They also value the ability to learn, which nowadays young adults can achieve through game experiences, both offline and virtual.

Coaching Calls

Upon beginning their virtual international internship, a participant will be assigned a designated Internship Coach. We request that all participants treat their **coaching calls as mandatory** and we send multiple reminders to ensure they are able to schedule.

Mid Coaching Call

is a conversation that will review the midpoint self-assessment taken in CareerBridge, as well as incorporate some guiding questions about the participant's internship experience and outline steps to take to make the second half a success.

End Coaching Call

is designed to look at the participant experience with this internship to highlight skills gained, professional pathways, and best practices for future career management. At the end of the call the intern will walk away with a *Global Career Management Plan*, noting key steps to take immediately and in the future in order to leverage the experience for future success.

Application Steps and Timeline

Application Steps



Form Application

Complete form application. In this application you will be able to upload your CV link, pass along key details, and more importantly select your chosen Career Field from our 18 choices.



Video Interview

Once you complete the application you will be asked to completed a one-way video interview. Here will be your chance to shine to prospective employers, sharing your motivation for completing the internship, past experience, and key goals.



Participation Confirmation

Once a full application is received it will be reviewed by Virtual Internships with Hanken School of Economics having the final approval of all applicants. If approved you will receive a formal offer letter and need to confirm prior to beginning the placement process.

March 13th

Students can complete their initial form application and submit resume/CV to Virtual Internships

March 16th

Students must have completed the Virtual Video Application and confirmed participation

March 23rd

All confirmed students will receive an official offer and once accepted the placement process will begin with students receiving request for interviews

May 2nd

All host company placements are confirmed at least 1 week prior to start date

May 9th

The internship will start on Monday, May 9th, with the student working directly with their company to set up their first meeting time and to determine their custom weekly schedule

Every week

The assigned Intern Experience Manager will check-in with the student to collect a timesheet and address any concerns

Every 2 weeks

All interns are invited to fortnightly webinars to help keep them engaged in a community

June 6th

The internship Coach will schedule a 30-minute check-in call at the mid-point to review their past work and develop a plan for a successful second half of the internship

July 1st

At the conclusion of the internship, all students will have a coaching call with their Internship Coach to unpack the supervisor evaluation and plan for the future

Common Questions

How will I communicate with my host company?

In a remote setting communication Varies from host company to company but will most likely be a combination of email, Skype/Slack or other messaging software, shared online docs and shared productivity tools like Trello. All Virtual Internship supervisors are required to have a weekly meeting with the intern.

Are these paid internships?

No, this is a professional development experience and to leverage the exchange of training and feedback for real-world work experience. Virtual Internships seeks meaningful connections and references for future full-time work with 36% of our interns are offered to extend their internship or a full-time position in the future.

How will this experience look on my resume and to potential employers?

Remote work is here to stay, making remote work experience especially valuable. In completing this internship you can gain skills like adaptability, flexibility, time-management, cross cultural fluency, and more! 91% of our alumni feel they are more employable than before they did the program.

What if I don't like the company you've matched me with?

Generally our team is very good at finding the best available company for you. If you truly feel it's not a good fit, you'll need to provide a detailed explanation as to why the opportunity does match your experiences, skill set, or career goals.
